Whangarei Nov 5th and 6th

The first weekend of November saw the return of Whangarei's big champ show – one of the few still held in conjunction with obedience and always a fun weekend. It's quite a challenge for the club as they have few helping members and not a huge amount of equipment or nearby clubs to borrow stuff from, so it wasn't possible to run a third ring, which would have speeded up the day a little. However, there wasn't a shortage of helpers to run classes - with all going to plan until a ripped tunnel caused a long delay and the last C jumpers didn't start until nearly 6 PM. It's amazing how a bit of pressure increases efficiency! Suddenly, everyone was there lining up and getting on to the start line promptly and a good speedy class judged by Martin Bush was finished in record time.

Although not appreciated by any dog owners, the firework display we always suffer at this event does add to the festive feeling. Surprisingly - as they live an isolated rural life – my own dogs seemed totally unaware of all the loud bangs and bright lights, being much more interested in checking out the trails of previous perambulating canines.

The clubrooms on the grounds housing the showers are those rather interesting older style ones with a slightly complicated minor rabbit warren appearance. Once communal, they're now divided by a tastefully arranged Warehouse-style tarp with a strategically placed chair so you can reach the handle of the shower, conveniently located next to the shower head on the ceiling...maybe they're used to hosting 6 foot 7 basketball players?? His earlier Intermediate was built on similar lines –

His senior was fun with a split weave set at a 45 degree angle built into a flowing course forming a circle with the addition of a tunnel. Interesting to have something a bit different without being impossibly difficult.

The Rhodes had a very successful weekend with Elaine winning all Jumpers A with Flare and all B with Bolt and Alan winning at least one Senior and several placings. Jinnie Gailey and Erin Ball also had multi wins as did Marilyn Lambert with Blaze, Chris Wallace with Dallas and Susan McKay and Phantom. In the mini section Bruce Ronald had 2 Jumpers B wins. Mustn't forget Ann Kenny, who won the first Starters despite being heavily involved in running the show. Lou Baker was unfortunate to suffer a fascia injury to her knee resulting in a trip to casualty and the news that she won't be competing again until after the new year. Especially gutting for her as she was enjoying quite a bit of success with her newest Sheltie, Pierro. Here's wishing her all the best for a speedy recovery. Also to Annette

Akarana/Manukau

Another club hosting an anniversary show this year – this time a 50th – Akarana put on a day to remember with beautiful ribbons and many generous prizes. Rosemary Baker – who, for those with short attention spans, was this year’s Zone 1 Starters representative with Kenzy the Border Terrier, made an excellent MC and kept events moving with a lively commentary and spot prizes based on the number 50. All good fun! Judges included overseas visitors from the dark side Teresa Ford and the ever sartorially elegant Graham Lawson. Another small club who have to rely on outside help – Counties members on their own grounds react almost automatically and Craig Owen from Hibiscus Coast was a man on a mission – he’s always out there helping wherever the venue.

Nor West Ribbon Trial Nov 19th

While a large number of agility people headed to Hawkes Bay, quite a few spent a more laid back weekend at Kumeu and Greenhithe for NorWest and North Shore’s ribbon trials. Apparently, finding judges for the weekend was quite a mission (I suspect many of them had gone South) but Tim Warneford, with Chris Richardson doing a couple of probationaries, saved

the day or both days, as it turned out.

Kumeu was quite relaxing with reduced space, smaller entry numbers and less rings running - but well run with again lots of help from outside clubs and Colleen Lauder doing a great job keeping things moving - and an early finish allowed the addition of a novelty sweep-stake Jumpers – a cunning figure of eight course designed by Chris, which caught out quite a few handlers and dogs. It was finally won by Chris Charlton with his schnauzer Peaches with a neat fast clear. from Annette Flannagan who, with Anna Snell took most of the other placings. There was a noticeable presence of German Shepherds on both days - it seems that old reprobate Paul Corringham collected them together and persuaded them to enter. Great to see some of them in the line up as well as Paul who has won consistently with his Shepherds for many years.

North Shore R T 20th Nov

Tim and Chris were again the double act in Ring 1 at North Shore, this time assisted by Brett Palmer aka Judge Dread,

who built Intermediate, Senior and AD in Ring 2. His senior was interesting and flowing, but 2 weaves and a large number of contacts (I think there were 10 altogether) took their toll. Rebecca Roper won this with Zito from Christine Wallace. Intermediate was quite challenging too with only 2 clear rounds. This was won by Maria Wales and Coal following up on her successes with the same dog and also her young Kelpie Bounce on the previous day. North Shore have a lot more members than Nor West, but were still glad of extra help, with Rosemary Baker, temporarily without a dog to run, appearing to be scribing for every class.

It was encouraging to see so many new handlers and dogs competing, some of them doing very well. The day ended with a 60 pole weave challenge which is always provides interest and excitement for spectators, and I love the dogs' expressions as they come towards the end.

by Michael Romanos finished top in the contacts event. Taylor had dislodged one more hurdles rail than did Millie whilst recording fastest times in both of the obstacle courses.

Mahony and Millie took home the new annual trophy that she (Natalie) had donated to the champs organising club, Wellington Welsh Corgi Walking Club.

Senior organiser, Michael Romanos said he was pleased that a large crowd attended the meeting despite the Wellington Christmas parade being held about the same time.

Other placegetters at the champs were two Cardigan Corgis, Woody and Dodge owned by Bridget Smeeton of Feilding. Last year's winner, Sue Lane and Miller of Hamilton did not compete. The champs were judged by Karen de Wit of Upper Hutt who also designed the courses.

Sponsors were Orijen premium dog food, Eukanuba, The Pet Centre, Animates, the Upper Hutt City Council and the Upper Hutt Dog Training School. The NZ Corgi Agility Champs are the only singular breed agility champs held in New Zealand.

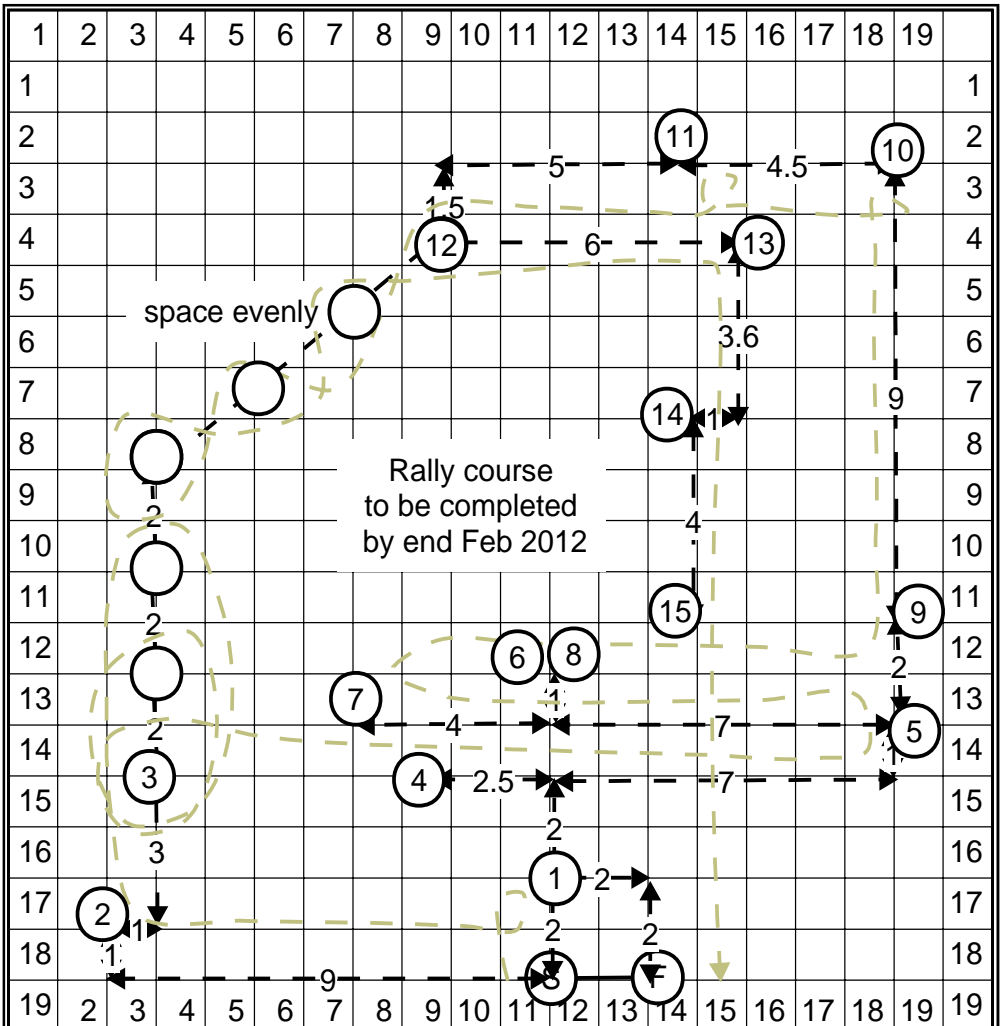

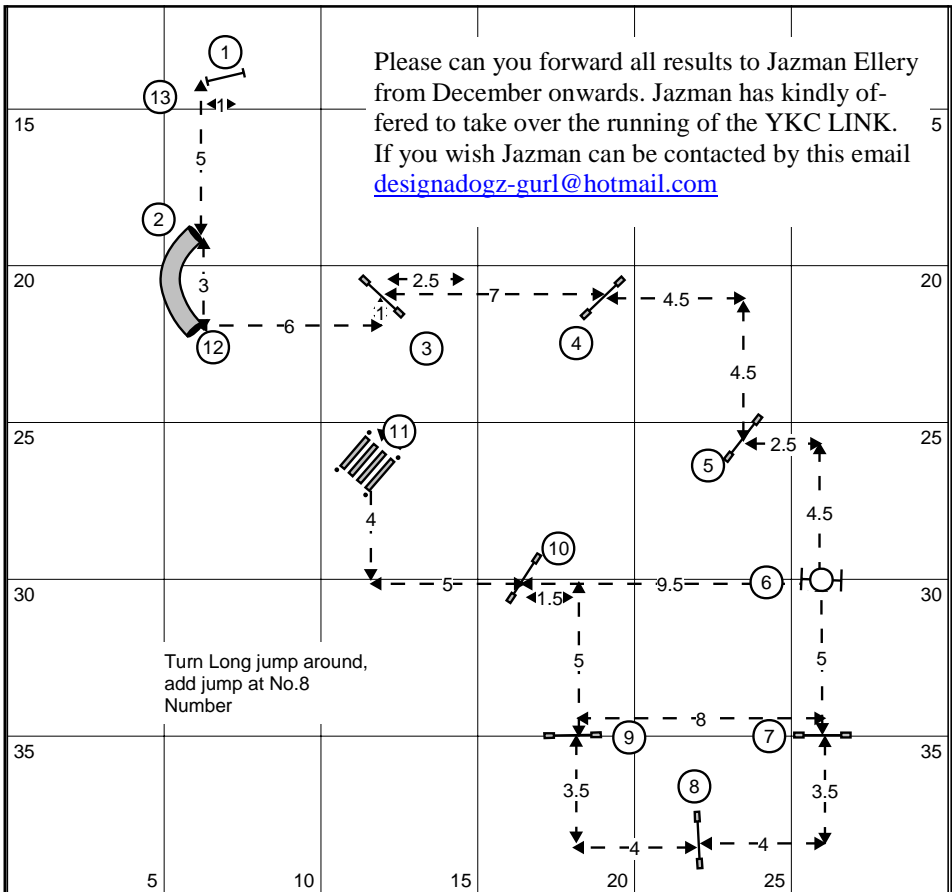

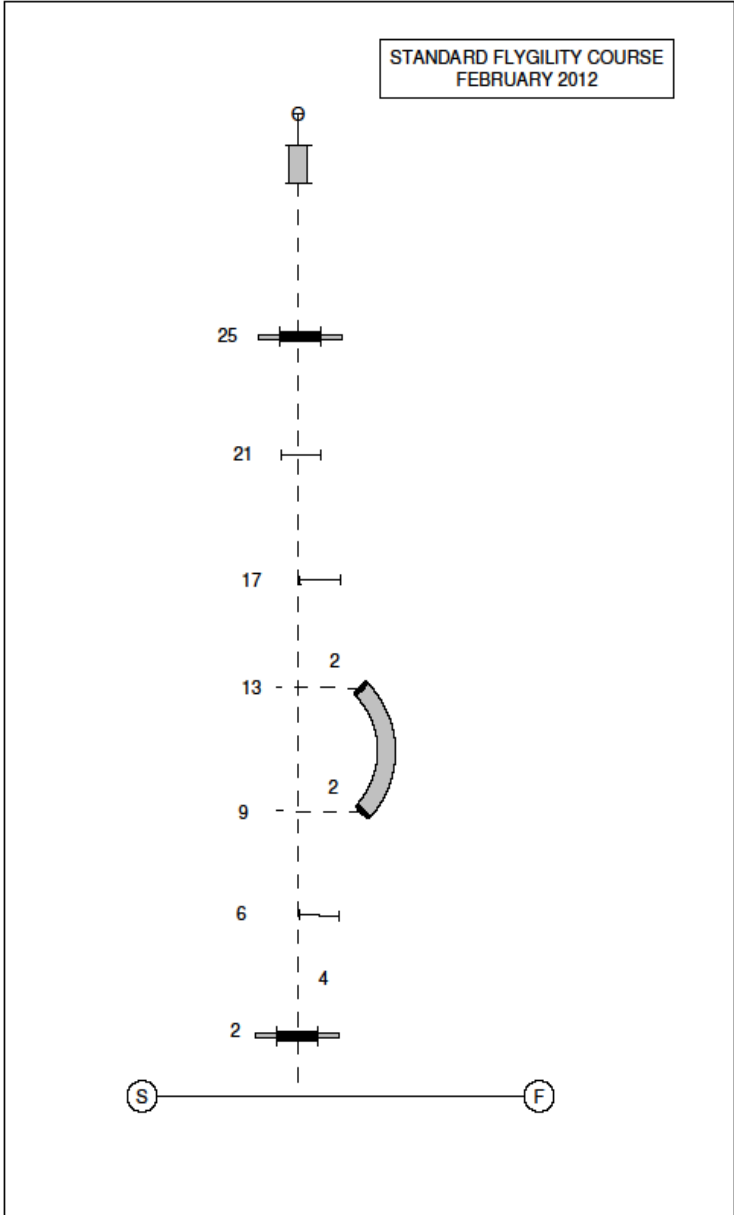
