### **What do Clubs do over the winter months?**

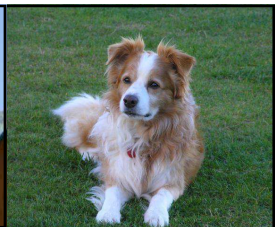

ADX was one of the first courses of the day with 41 entries. It was a brilliant course for me, as I was going to try to run for the first time in a few weeks. I knew I'd be slow so I was quite pleased when I saw there were no weaves. This meant I could make up time elsewhere. After getting round a reasonable amount of the course unfortunately I was so focused on being careful with my leg and although my dog knew where she was going, I obviously did not and pushed her away from the most obvious jump. Gutted! Thanks Keri Neilson for not being too hard on me. ADX had 11 clear rounds in total, so I couldn't have been too bad.

Scribe sheets were proving a challenge for Diana. Dog numbers, dogs not matching the events etc. I got rather a stern look from Diana as I'd given the wrong dog number for Starters and had also marked the wrong event for my Senior running dog. I put it down to injury brain!!! We really do have to be more proactive in checking our number with the scribe. It's not their fault if the number is written wrong on the double pad system.

### **Tauranga**

Though Tokoroa shipped in competitors from the South Island, Huntly managed to bring in 399 dogs against Tokoroa's 353. As mentioned in my March report, the four way splits were seen back at the beginning in Starters, Novice and Jumpers C.

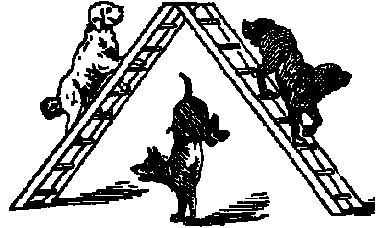
# 10 tips for teaching the Aframe

Choose a method that suits your dog.

1

Take into account what your dog likes to do, as well as the weight and structure of your dog. Methods include a stopped two on-two off and

a running contact. You need to shape a target for stopped contacts and use aids such as boxes or mats to



Keep the Aframe low at the start of

training so the dog learns to run on and run off. If you put it up too quickly they will feel they have to leap to get up and over the top.

teach the running contact. A running contact is less stressful on the body, and easier to teach as in NZ A-frames are fairly similar.

3

The most rewarded part for the dog should be the most important part to us which is the last 1 metre. Make sure you reward the dog for interacting with this last crucial metre!

Work on INDEPENDENT CONTACTS. If your dog can get the contact without you at its side it opens up a whole new world of handling possibilities!

Maintain your criteria = decide clearly what you expect from your dog and be consistent. Dogs prefer their handlers to be black and white, as soon as you give a little, they will take a little more, which results in missing contacts.

Add distractions. This means moving your Aframe so the background changes, leaving things lying around (toys, food containers etc), other dogs nearby, people watching/moving alongside/staring, and place other equipment nearby...just some suggestions.

Try not to LURE the Aframe (See #4 above)

A common discrimination is a tunnel under the Aframe. This is one situation where good verbal cues are an asset. If your dog can discriminate between “walk on” and “through” then you will be better able to successfully conquer these types of discriminations.

If you havent got an Aframe at home you can simulate it by getting two old doors and connecting them at the top and sit them on a Workmate—the important thing in the end is to get a similar angle for the dog as a competition Aframe.

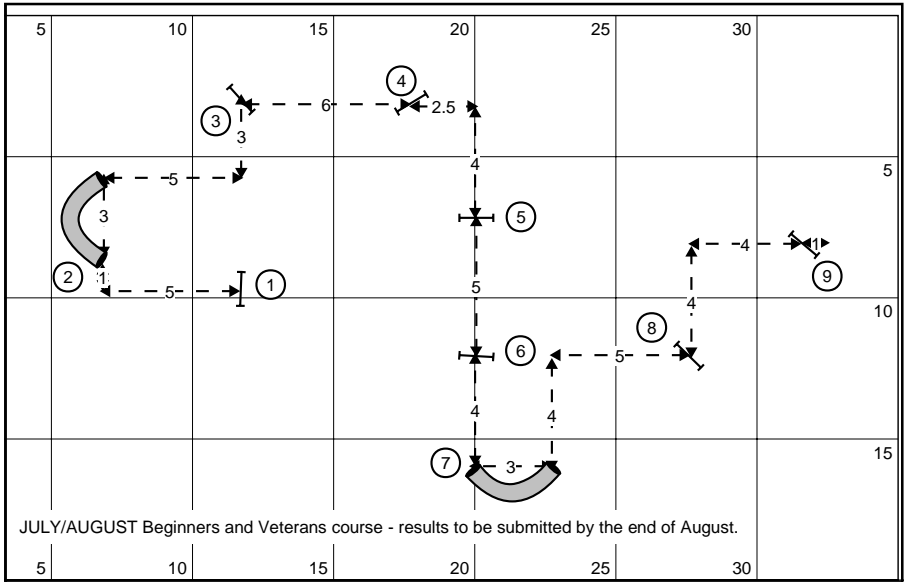
Alternative aids that may be used with training the Aframe are:- Hoops—placed at the bottom of the Aframe to lower the dog’s head as it nears the end of the obstacle. Stride regulators—usually guttering or large poles that the dog has to step over—thesde are used to encourage a 2-3 stride over the Aframe.

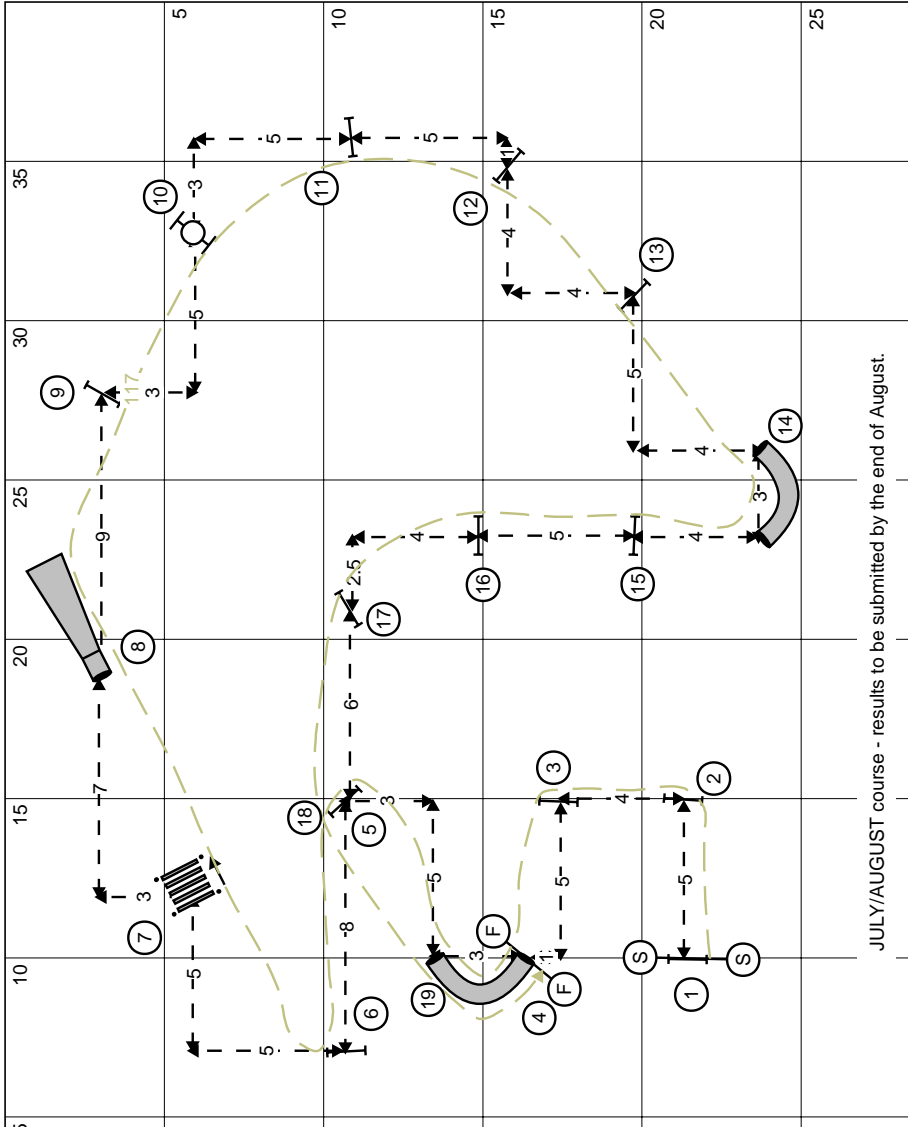

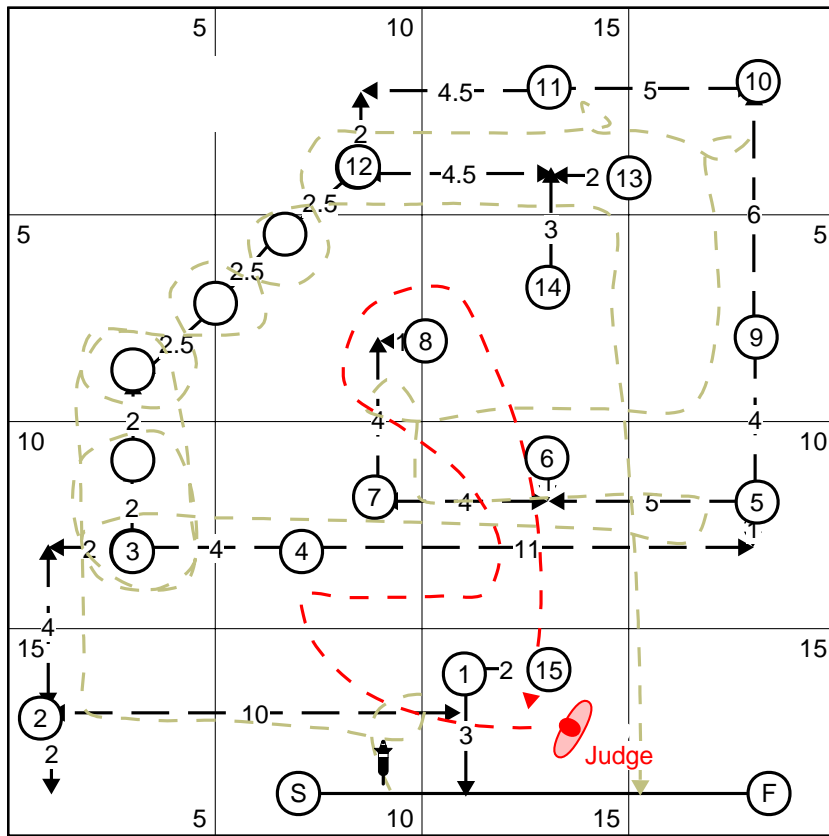

*I just thought Wow.*

I know there are many of you out there with fantastic qualifications. We need to wear these with pride. One of the things that I find a bit sad is that when the dog with the qualifications dies those qualifications become historic. Food for thought, what titles can the owner/handler retain to let everyone know that they have attained Grand Champ ADX gold or other top qualifications. Maybe it should be a star sign to say that this handler has already had dogs to this level. Such as one star, two stars, three stars etc. Especially in the case of Grand Champs. The dedication and commitment that goes into training to get these levels of qualification are just amazing. This is the inspirational part of Dog Eventing.

The other thing is that the general public are not really aware of the amount of positive energy that dog training engenders, or the levels of responsibility that dog training owners achieve. That means there is a lack of marketing and publicity at Club level within our communities. There are heaps of ways we could increase the Good Dog Publicity with our local papers and radio stations and even community TV.

The other qualifications that might be missing from our stable of qualifications are **NALA qualifications**. An electronic Honours Board with all the winners from throughout the years might be a nice addition to our website. This is a major achievement and should be marked by more than a ribbon at year's end. I remember that my Chan ended up 14th in the Fly one year. I was stoked. Another one of our members Hilary Quemby with Jay came in the top ten for Fly standard one year and that was massive for our little Club. I believe that the level of commitment to NALA ought also to be celebrated by a NCh system maybe. More Food for thought, points for argument, let's get some feedback.

Hi. My name is Roselle Bremmers and I have been competing in NALA Flygility since the early 2000's. I first started competing with my border collie Kelly who absolutely loved flygility. She came 2nd in NZ in her first year running NALA Challenge Flygility and the Waimakariri Team came 1st in NZ that year. After a break of more than 5 years, I started competing with my new dog Quiz, a border collie/heading dog cross. While not overly ball orientated, Quiz took to flygility like a duck takes to water. Her excitement and sheer joy when doing flygility makes this a very enjoyable sport for both of us.

Our first official flygility competition was at the Taupo NDTA in 2010. We gained one point, being knocked out in the 2nd round. Quiz has since gone on to become very competitive in flygility and she recently gained her FDX title. This is quite an achievement, as

flygility competitions have been few and far between in the Canterbury area.

It's really good to see the Christchurch clubs starting to run flygility tournaments on a regular basis and hopefully before too long we will have enough Senior dogs to make a really good competition. There are currently only 2 Advanced dogs in Canterbury, so I recently travelled to Invercargill to gain experience in running Advanced courses.

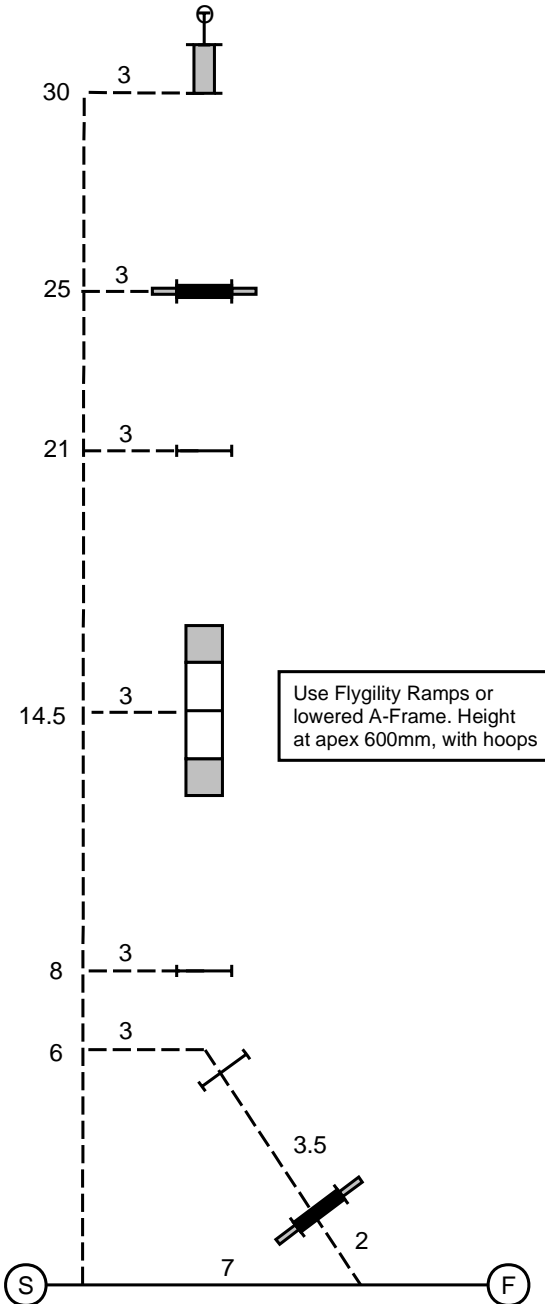

I hope you enjoy this month's courses.

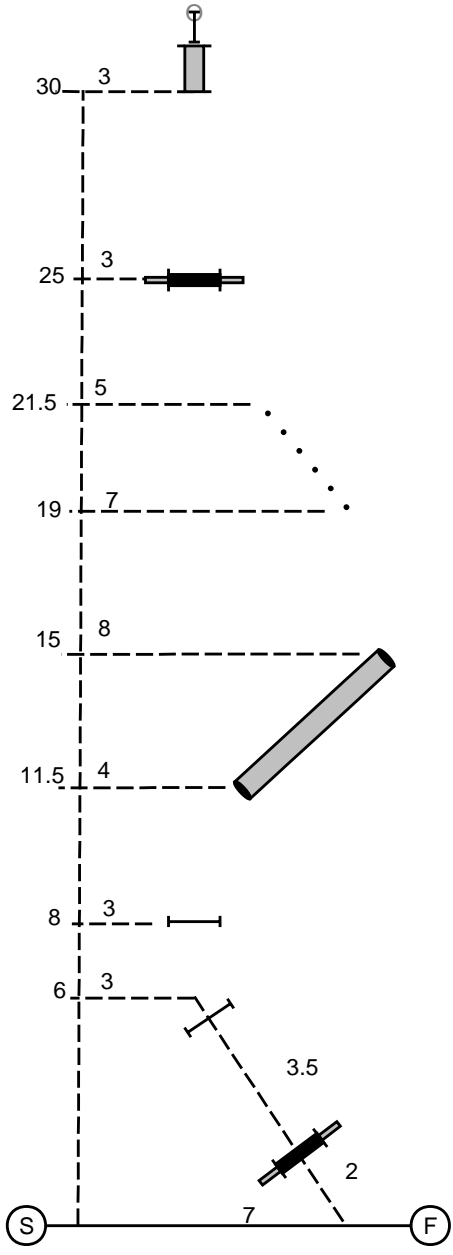


**Quiz at her 2nd Flygility Tournament in Wanaka**
