Mount Maunganui/Tauranga Jumpers Aug 3 & 4th

The pony club grounds at the Mount are almost on the beach with a wonderful free draining surface and perfect winter conditions for two days of Jumpers. It's a shame the council don't allow camping as it's the perfect spot with a huge space for running dogs, complete with desiccated horse dung and rabbit trails and of course, the beach a stone's throw away.

After almost 2 weeks of dry weather, the forecast was not particularly inspiring and I would never have found my way to Papamoa Village campgrounds without the aid of my satnav in the dark drizzly conditions, negotiating the road works that seem to have been going on for ever.

The day finished nice and early at around 3 with plenty of time for walks on the beach.

The team trials were held at Te Hihi over the weekend of the 17th and 18th August. However quite exciting as there were some close finishes. Taupo Jumpers and Ribbon Trial Aug 24 25th

And so to Taupo. I have mixed feeling about this event - I like the venue, though as it's small there's only room for 2 rings so there's always a chance of a late finish, which didn't happen this time, despite the brief ceremony on Sunday attended by local dignitaries, to open the new clubrooms officially. Quite smart they are too with a neo-nostalgia 50s single storey imported bungalow with lovely big kitchen and an office full of stressed officials.

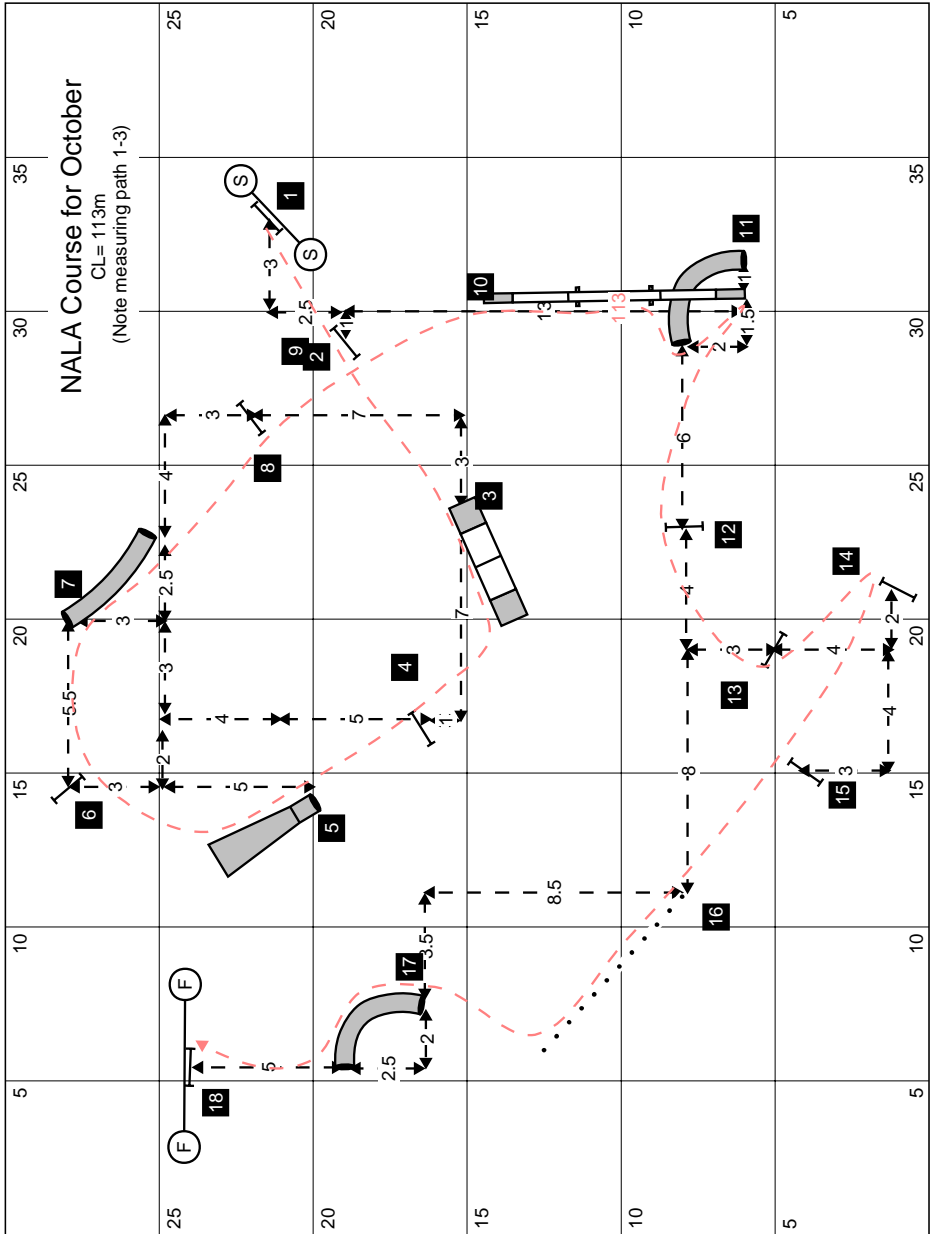

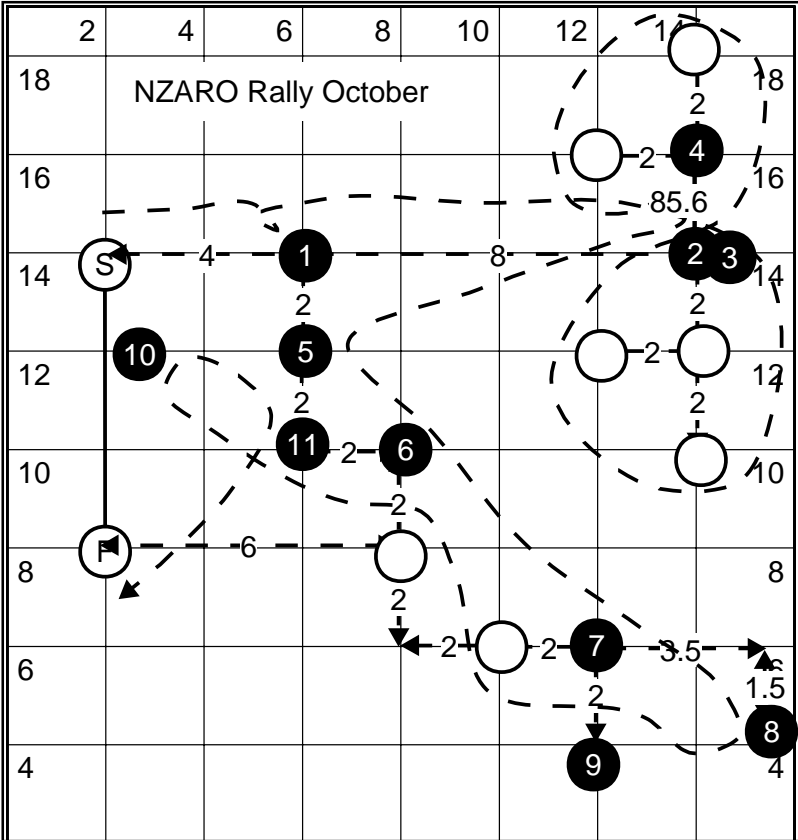
AGILITY LINK COURSE for October

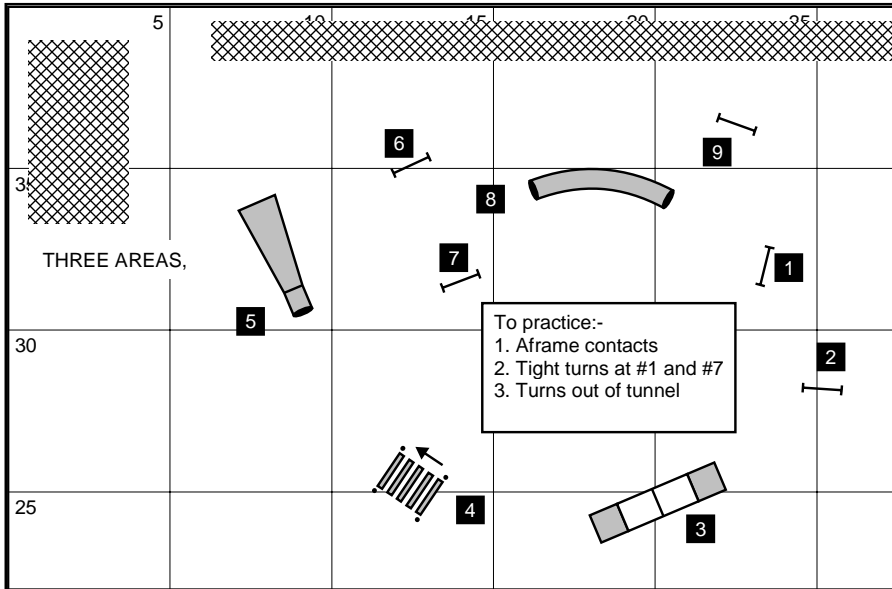

THIS MONTHS TRAINING at UPPER HUTT.



We have been splitting the class into 3 groups (which works in quite well with the 3 height groups—small, midi and maxi).

Usually we split the exercises into a Jumping group, contacts group and weaving group, but this month we did something slightly different. The idea was to give each group a short course, so that they could hone their skills on a longer sequence. Within each sequence was a list of skills to work on.

The same plan is used for 3-4 weeks in a row. This has a few advantages :-

1. People get to know where the equipment goes so that setup is faster.
2. People get to work on the same skills over a period of a few weeks, so hopefully they improve at them.

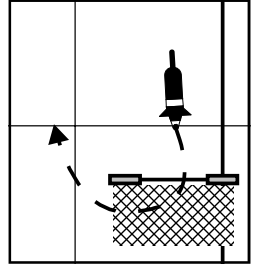
This discusses one of those sequences.

Sequence ONE (Aframe).

The main aims were :-

- Tight turns and #1 and #7
- Correct direction out of tunnel #8.

We put a pole on the ground so show the ideal turning distance for each height of dogs, as the dogs should be able to turn within 380mm for small dogs, 575mm for midis and 675mm for maxis (see diagram right).



How to achieve a tight turn at #1.

Some suggestions (See what works best for you)-

1. Leadout to the landing side and serpentine #1
2. Send and pull, from takeoff side of #1
3. Send and back cross #1
4. Leadout pivot

5-6-7-8 sequence.

A dog comes out of the collapsible tunnel slightly disorientated. Does your dog speed out, or does he come out quite slowly? This could affect your handling.

Some suggestions (Try them and see what works best for you).

1. Stay in the area between the tunnel and the jumps, pull the dog over #6 and #7, turn the dog right and push into the tunnel, back cross and call dog over #9.
2. Move across and front cross #6. Work dog over #7 and turn left, into tunnel. Back cross tunnel, Blind cross tunnel (running on the left hand side) or run really fast along the right side of the tunnel and catch him as he exits and direct over #9.

The last week we might just repeat the sequence again, which gives is 18 obstacles—a whole course!

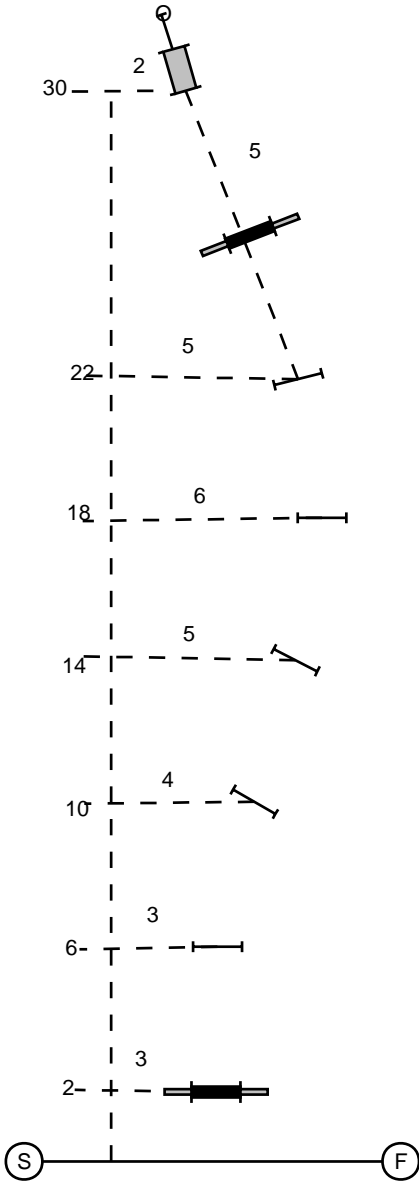
